Activity Report

Next Up at Creative Pinellas: Expanding Waters Exhibit

Artists Carol Mickett and Robert Stackhouse, the 2020-2021 Creative Pinellas Artist Laureate, are behind the creation of *Expanding Waters*, which focuses on the issue of climate change and how it is impacting our waters. The exhibition opens March 17th and runs through June 13th, 2021. It is the aim of the artists to shed light on the devastating consequences of increased CO₂ in our environment and explore ways of mitigating the warming and, hence, expansion of our ocean waters. The exhibition will use both visual and performing art and involve social engagement, to raise public consciousness around this critical issue and inspire positive action for our oceans. A large-scale installation suspended from the ceiling at the center of the gallery, will become the setting for live performances of theater, dance, and literature, focused on the theme of the show. *Expanding Waters* will also include a Thought Experiment room where attendees can share their thoughts and renderings of their observations and solutions.



2021-2022 Professional Artist Grantees

Creative Pinellas is pleased to announce the 2021 Professional Artist Grant recipients: Cecilia Lueza, David Manson, Donald Gialanella, Gloria Muñoz, Helen French, Kaitlin Murphy-Knudsen, Kenny Jensen, Sarah Gerard, Takeya Trayer, and Tenea Johnson. This is the sixth cycle of the Professional Artist Grant, awarded annually to Pinellas County artists of outstanding talent and ability who, with a history of increasingly successful work on the local, national, or international stage, bring recognition, awareness, and interest to our community, and inspire other artists and art lovers. Professional Artist Grants are designed to support and sustain Pinellas County's creative community and to enhance the County as an arts and cultural destination. Grantees blog weekly, participate in artist conversations and workshops, write in Creative Pinellas' online magazine, and are invited to show work at the Creative Pinellas Arts Annual, which will be in its fourth year and the Arts Annual BTW program that places work in area hotels and will be in its third year.

Helen French has been chosen as the 2021 Artist Laureate. A native of St. Pete and graduate of Gibbs High School Pinellas County Center for the Arts, French received her BFA from The Juilliard School and was a dancer with the prestigious Buglisi Dance Theatre in New York City. French is committed to arts education and developing the next generation of artists. Throughout the grant period, she will partner and collaborate Creative Pinellas to share her experience, expertise, and energies to advance the arts community in Pinellas County.



Arts Navigator

The interactive digital project, that allows visitors to put together an arts and cultural itinerary designed especially for them, continues to move forward. The Software Engineering Firm SourceToad, that specializes in developing applications for the tourism industry, is under contract with regular meetings with Creative Pinellas staff.

SPACEcraft

SPACEcraft brings creativity into an active environment, sharing hands-on art experiences inside of two converted shipping containers. Both instructor-led and self-guided programs on the themes of Make, Play, Read, and Grow invites people to interact and create together. SPACEcraft travels throughout the county with new stops every eight weeks. In February, the cities of Seminole and Palm Harbor served as hosts. With an Average of 60 visitors per week, SPACEcraft data is recording zipcodes from Tallahassee, Opa-Locka, Spring Hill, Brooksville and New Port Richey.



Gialanella in the Gardens

In partnership with the Florida Botanical Gardens (FBG), Gialanella in the Gardens continues to draw visitors. Sculptor Don Gialanella's welded assemblage sculptures, created from discarded steel objects, are artfully displayed in the lush settings throughout the Gardens. Given the setting, the exhibit has been open to the public since March 2020 and will be featured through March 2021. The Virtual Tour has been featured on the Creative Pinellas Arts In programming as well as on FBG's Social Media.


